The Pedagogy Study Group of the American Musicological Society (AMS) announces the 2018 annual Teaching Music History Conference, which will take place on the weekend of 8-9 June 2018 at Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Indiana. We invite proposals on all topics related to teaching music history (broadly defined) at any academic level (K-12, higher education, community) and the issues its practitioners face. This year, we are particularly interested in presentations that address the following topics:

- Music, Pedagogy, and the Dynamics of Power
- Commemoration versus Celebration in the Teaching of Music History
- Accessibility, Diversity and Inclusion in Musicological Pedagogy and Its Practitioners

Drawing on the guidelines for proposals for national meetings of the AMS, all proposals should represent the presentation as fully as possible. A successful proposal typically articulates the main aspects of the argument or findings clearly, positions the author's contribution with respect to previous work in the discipline, and suggests the paper's significance for the musicological and pedagogical community, in language that is accessible to scholars from a variety of specializations. Regardless of topic, all proposals will undergo a blind evaluation process assessing submissions according to the above criteria, and submitters will be notified of conference program decisions by 1 March 2018.

The conference will feature a variety of presentation formats, ranging from individual presentations to teaching demonstrations to posters. One afternoon will be devoted to an "unconference" that will be informal, participatory, and webcast live for those unable to attend the conference.
